

CGCU Motor Club Contingency Claims

Trailer Repairs

In order to transport our karts to different tracks around the country we have a trailer which can transport 4 karts. Whilst returning from a trip the plywood boards collapsed rendering the trailer unusable without repair and the club unable to run any trips with our own karts. Luckily the karts on the trailer weren't damaged at the time.

The repair costs are listed below and are just for the materials required to complete the repairs. In order to reduce costs we have repaired the trailer ourselves, saving in the region of £400.

As this expenditure was unexpected the club doesn't have the funds to cover the cost of the repairs. There isn't anything we could have done to prevent the collapse, especially as the trailer is stored off campus which makes regular maintenance impossible. The repairs we've completed should ensure the trailer can withstand whatever the British weather can throw at it.

Jerry can Storage Box

After a recent inspection by the site fire officer the cupboard used to store our jerry cans in was deemed unsuitable for this purpose due to it not being able to retain the contents of the jerry cans if they were to leak. This cupboard was provided to the club when we were moved to our current garage for the purpose of storing jerry cans. As we've had numerous inspections in previous years which haven't indicated this as a problem, the need to purchase a new cupboard is completely unexpected.

We need our jerry cans in order to store petrol for use in both our fleet of go-karts and the clubs classic Mini. The container required is a storage box for 4 jerry cans which will meet the requirements the fire officer has requested. Without this container our garage will be shut down and the club prevented from using its equipment.

We are requesting £342.00 to purchase the following storage box.
