CGCU Civil Eng (604)	<p>Over the last 10 years CivSoc, the Imperial Civil Engineering Student Society, has taken a party of around 70 students annually on an international tour to a destination in Europe. All the undergraduates in the Department were given the option to vote for their preferred destination out of Krakow in Poland, Naples in Italy, and Vienna in Austria. The destination that received the most votes, Naples, was taken forward as the destination for CivSoc's 2016 Tour.</p> <p>The tour has five key objectives. Firstly, it is an opportunity for all of the civil engineering undergraduate students within Imperial to experience aspects of civil engineering outside the UK. The students will gain an insight into engineering in Naples and the challenges faced locally through a visit to University of Naples Federico II. The Department of Civil Engineering there will give talks on their research in structural aluminium, of which they are the world leaders, and on their use of virtual reality simulators for research into transport networks. Secondly, a visit to Pompeii, a Roman city dating back over 2500 years, will be undertaken to show what engineers did in the past and allowing observations to be made on how such an old city remains preserved.</p> <p>Thirdly, the visit would also allow us to improve relations with the wider student community. ACC Triathlon (067)	<p>There are two main purposes to the TriC Easter Tour 2016, namely training for the oncoming triathlon season and enhancing cultural and historic experience of the team.</p> <p>The main focus of the tour will be training. With the change to race rules meaning peloton cycling has become essential, the flat roads leading to Amsterdam provide optimal conditions of flat ground and non-busy roads to train in a group, both things lacked in London. This will give members much needed experience to feel confident enough to train this way upon return. In addition to the training during the tour itself, the prospect of completing the cycling itinerary as a group will provide members with a challenging event to train for.</p> <p>The cultural focus will be provided by passing through cities such as The Hague, Rotterdam and Amsterdam. Whilst many people will fly directly to Amsterdam, fewer will visit its neighbouring cities and the culture here. Furthermore we will cycle through many smaller towns offering the opportunity to contrast the large scale tourist locations to a more local environment.</p> <p>Historically we will visit Almere the location of the oldest and longest running triathlon in the world. Cycling and running at this location gives members a taste of what endurance triathlons, something not regularly offered by the club, are like.</p>	<p>The plan is to cycle the 150 miles from London to Amsterdam over a three day period.</p> <p>We intend on taking 15 participants. Meeting at Queens Tower we will then to cycle the 87 miles to Harwich. This will consist of 14 cyclists and a driver taking a 9 seater mini bus who will rotate periodically. In Harwich we will catch the night ferry to Hoek van Holland. This will provide us with both a night's accommodation and transport, for the price of just the transportation. From there we will cycle the remaining distance to our accommodation in Amsterdam via Rotterdam and The Hague. Once bikes have been deposited we will commence on a running tour of Amsterdam before a swim warm down in the evening. In the morning we will cycle out to Almere where we will cycle part of the historic triathlon circuit. A&E A Cappella (421)	<p>The primary aim of this tour is to promote interaction between the society's groups, and to advertise a cappella (both to members and the public) as a genre rather than focussing on individual groups.
